

RESURRECTION EASTER ROLLS

What is the resurrection rolls meaning?

This unique recipes for Easter rolls is used to tell the story of Jesus dying, being placed in a tomb, and then arising, making the tomb empty. You tell the Easter story during the steps of making, baking and eating.

To make these easy resurrection rolls you'll need:

- Crescent rolls
- Large marshmallows
- Cinnamon
- Sugar
- Butter

The “miracle magic” that makes these an empty tomb food craft is simply that the marshmallow melts, but the crescent roll stays “puffed” up. So, when you cut into it the inside “tomb” of the roll is empty — just like when Jesus arose from the dead!

How Long To Cook Resurrection Rolls

Bake resurrection rolls for 15 minutes and allow to cool slightly before cutting into the empty tomb rolls.

Resurrection Rolls Story

1. The dough represents the tomb that they put Jesus into after his crucifixion.
2. The white marshmallow represents Jesus.
3. The cinnamon and sugar mixture represents the oils and spices that was rubbed on Jesus after his death before, they placed him in the tomb.
4. Wrapping each side of the dough up and over the marshmallow, explaining that the dough represents the tomb where they buried Jesus.

When making these “tomb” rolls, walk kids through the first one and tell the story as you assemble it.
